

# Record of the German Reformed Church at Wolfsville

Before the organization of a German Reformed Congregation at Wolfsville, the members of the Reformed Community residing in the neighborhood, had been accustomed to attend worship at the Reformed Church at Cauton, and at Jerusalem Church, about three miles distant, the latter of which from an early date had been supplied with regular preaching by Reformed ministers from Frederick & Middletown. Lately it was connected with the Middletown Charge. A few years previous to the year 1845, divine services ceased to be held in it by the Reformed Minister at Middletown. For several years therefore there was no Reformed minister, that preached anywhere between Cauton & Middletown, and the members of the Reformed church were as sheep without a shepherd, to their great loss, and the loss of the church. In the spring of the year 1847, they procured the services of the Rev. Theodore Apple, pastor of the Cauton Charge, who commenced to preach regularly at a school house near Wolfsville, and at another on the top of the mountain, commonly called Senseback. In the summer of 1847, he catechized, alternately, at both these points, and in the fall held Communion and confirmed sixteen of those who had attended his lectures. From this time onward, it began to be seen & felt, that a church ought to be built and a congregation organized as soon as possible. A subscription was started for the purpose of building a new church, which met with enough encouragement to induce the brethren to look forward with confidence in the ultimate success of their efforts. By the spring of '48 the good work had succeeded so far that it was thought advisable to organize a new congregation, which, accordingly, with the permission of Class, was done on the 27th. of May, when the

## Record Continued

During the summer of 1848, preparations were made to commence the new church, but owing to circumstances, beyond the control of the congregation, the corner stone was not laid until the spring of the year 1849. The Rev. John Rebough, of Greencastle, and Rev. George W. Gleason, were present on this occasion, and delivered impressive discourses to a large audience, the former in the English, the latter in the German language. Still hearts seem to be encouraged to carry the work forward to completion. On the 10th of Nov. following the new church was dedicated to the service of the Triune God, at which time large collections & subscriptions were received. The brethren, Rev. Daniel Zacharias D.D. of Fredrick City, and Rev. C. F. McCauley of Middletown, and assisted in the services of the occasion. Thus our labors and prayers were blessed, and the Great Head of the Church was pleased to give us a house, wherein we, and our children's children in distant times, might worship his name, and hear a pure gospel, as it is set forth in the Heidelberg Catechism. Whilst the walls of the material walls were going up, it was hoped, that, by the visitations of the pastor, his catechetical lectures, and his preaching on the Sabbath, the spiritual building was going up in our hearts, and that as a building fitly framed together, we as a congregation may long remain to let our light shine, that others seeing our good works, may be led to glorify ~~them~~ God also. For the expenses of building the church, and the persons, who contributed to its erection see the back part of this book.

Rules & Regulations adopted by the Gen. Reformed Congregation  
at Wolfsville.

Article 1. All the regular male members of this congregation have an equal right in every transaction, and an interest in all the premises appertaining to the congregation.

Article 2. There shall be at least five Trustees of this congregation, who shall at all times consist of the minister duly elected, and at least four church officers, one half of whom shall serve as elders, and remain in office two years, and it shall be so arranged that one half of them shall be elected every year, the eldest of whom shall be relieved by such annual elections; the other half of the said Trustees shall serve as Deacons, and it shall be so arranged, that one half shall be elected every year, the eldest in office shall be relieved annually as aforesaid.

Article 3. The council shall at all times previous to every election duly notify the congregation by their minister of such election, and a majority attending on the day of the election shall be considered a majority of the congregation.

Article 4. The election of Church-Officers shall be on Easter Monday, or within thirty days thereof.

Article 5. The Church Council, or Consistory shall on the day of giving notice when an election for church officers is to be held, nominate as many candidates as are to be elected, and invite the congregation to nominate as many more, but in case the congregation refuses, or neglects to make such nomination, then the Consistory, or Council shall nominate double the number required, out of the number so nominated, the number of officers required shall be elected.

Article 6. The newly elected Trustees or Church

shall be recorded in the "Church Record" of the church, but if the minister should not be present to perform to perform those duties, or the congregation should at the time be without a minister, the Consistory, or Council shall have them installed into office by some German Reformed minister in the neighborhood of said congregation.

Article 7. The electing, receiving, or engaging of a minister shall always be done by the Consistory, with the consent of a majority of the congregation, and all elections for a minister shall be held with tickets free & upright, without restraint, or hindrance of the voters in their choice.

Article 8. According to a resolution of Synod, it is strictly enjoined on the elders & Consistory, that they permit no suspended minister into the pulpit and that they be very cautious in permitting strangers to preach for them, until they produce sufficient credentials of their good and regular standing in some evangelic congregation.

Article 9. No minister shall be engaged as the pastor of this congregation, who is not a regular member of the German Reformed Synod of the United States of America.

Article 10. The Trustees aforesaid shall henceforth be known & distinguished by the style, name & title of the Consistory of the German Reformed Church, in & about Wexville Wd.

Article 11. This Corporation, and their successors in office shall always possess the power & authority vested in them by an act of the Assembly, as a body politic, or corporate, under the following restrictions to wit:

1. The Consistory shall at no time build, purchase, or sell any property belonging to the congregation or transact any business at its discretion.

Rules and Regulations Continued.

2. The Consistory shall apply all the estate, property, gifts, interests, annuities of the congregation to the maintenance of the public buildings, the support of the minister, and other benevolent objects.

3. The Consistory shall also render an account of all their transactions annually, immediately after the election, or at some meeting of the congregation previously appointed.

4. The Consistory cannot enter upon any business, unless every member thereof, if not indisposed, or absent from home, be duly notified of the time and place of meeting, but if all the members had due notice, one half shall constitute a quorum and proceed to business.

5. The Consistory shall elect annually from among themselves a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. All the transactions of the Consistory must be signed by the President and Secretary. The Consistory further fills any vacancies that occur among its officers.

With the above regulation the congregation was regularly incorporated at Frederick City, Md.

At a settlement made on the 20th. of April 1850, the church was indebted as follows: Each creditor agreed to deduct 10 percent from his bill.

The Rev. Mr. Apple tendered his resignation of the Cave Towns Charge, was accepted, and a meeting of the joint Conventories was held at Cave Town, and an invitation extended to Rev. J. W. Santos to visit said charge. The charge was visited, and a call extended to him, which was accepted by the Rev. J. W. Santos, entered upon the duties of his office the 27<sup>th</sup> of April 1851. which, after a brief interval, gave the State ministrations of the Sanctuary to this people. He was ordained Oct. 23<sup>rd</sup> 1852.

The Officers of the Congregation at that time were

The Congregation deeming it important to have morning preaching occasionally, presented their request to the Cave Town Congregation, and urged upon them to accede, the matter was duly presented to them at a public meeting for that purpose, when it was resolved to accede to the request of the Wolfville congregation, provided they would increase the subscription five dollars, making it forty dollars instead of thirty five. This proposition was accepted by the Wolfville people, thus giving them one half morning preaching, or every other time.

On the 11<sup>th</sup> of April, 1852, due notice having been given, the Congregation assembled for the purpose of electing Officers of the Church, and they made choice of the following

These Brethren were duly installed by the Rev.

Nothing special occurred during the year 1853-4-5, The Gospel was regularly preached, every four weeks, alternately in the Morning, the Sacraments administered, and as far as could well be, the wants of the people were attended to, during this period of time, peace and harmony prevailed among the Members, and regard & respect for the Pastor. Every thing pertaining to the Congregation moved forward quietly and, it is trusted successfully. Salary paid to Pastor during this period \$40.

An election was held in the Spring of 1855, for Deacons which resulted in the Choice of Mr. Jacob Williams & Elias Recher, These Brethren were duly installed according to the Rules & Constitution of the Church, This will also show the amount contributed for Benevolence, In addition to that already acknowledged there was collected June 3<sup>rd</sup> 1855. \$3.00 - Aug. 26<sup>th</sup> 1855 - \$3.32. Amt \$6.32.

During the year 1856-7 the Congregation steadily worshipped as usual, Services every four weeks with an occasional Sermon in two weeks. Peace prevailed and attendance as usual, tolerably good, The Congregation did not prosper outwardly as it might have done owing to untoward influences without, the Country filled with bigotry. Still it held its own, Elias Recher, Deacon, moved from the bounds of the Cong. and Paul, Krafer, was elected who was duly installed, but in removing, Frederick Biser was elected in his place, & installed, by now at the close of the year 1857 the officers are Philip Marenfels, & John Recher Elders, Jacob Williams & Fred. Biser, Deacons.

The amt of Salary paid for support of four Pastor is \$40. which is always paid.

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The history of the Congregation for the year 1859-9.60. is not  
 much varied. The preaching was regular. Means of Grace,  
 pretty well attended, Peace prevailing. The Means, as  
 used in the G. R. Ch., employed as such as Catechisation,  
 preached word &c. &c, the members, generally, remaining  
 free from the fanaticism shown by Sects around it.  
 The officers have been Elder. Philip Wareful, John  
 Recher, Deacons. Jacob William, - Frederick Riser,  
 In the Spring of 1860 an election was held, when Dan-  
 iel Wareful, was elected Elder, Jacob Wareful, &  
 Frederick Leatherman Deacons - Salary paid to pastor  
 about \$50.

From the year 1860 to April 30. 1867, there has not been  
 any thing of special interest. The peace of the Cong. has been pre-  
 served, During the fearful years of our Civil War, when other Con-  
 gregations were rent asunder, by the preaching of politics,  
 instead of a pure Gospel, our Membership remained firm  
 & the preaching was pretty well attended. Indeed, as far  
 as we had nothing to do with politics, & preached the Gospel  
 in this way had the confidence of the people, The growth  
 of the Cong. in Membership & piety, was not what  
 could be wished, but it is believed that much was  
 done, even by keeping the Members together. The

Besides the above the Congregation received \$160.00, from Mr. John Recher, one of the Trustees, who received the proceeds of a sale, for the German Reformed people, of a piece of ground belonging to the Congregation in Middletown Valley, known as Jerusalem Church, which money Mr. Recher paid by agreement, of said interested party, to the Congregation at Wolfsville, Frederick Co. in the year 1849.

In addition to the above, by an action of the Members of the Congregation, passed at a meeting, held in the Church, Jan 28, 1879 it was ordered that the following should be recorded, Received from Daniel Biser, who collected from Daniel Mann, Executor of the Estate of Jacob A. Summers, dec. One Hundred & Sixty Dollars, money held by said Summers & coming from the sale of property, as stated above, which money was appropriated by the Congregation for repairs to the Church.

Proceedings of a Meeting of the Members of the Reformed Congregation, at Holfsville, Frederick Co. Md.

The members met according to notice, on Jan. 28. 1879. Opened with prayer by the Pastor. Some preliminary business was attended to, with the Pastor in the Chair, after which the action on the preceding page was passed, that the reception of said \$106 be recorded, as received from Daniel Main, Esq. of the estate of Jac. A. Summers, dec. by Daniel Riser and was used in repairing the house. The house was repaired, putting on Cupola, Bell, inside & outside painting, Chancel railing & Pulpit, involving an expense of \$600. It was stated that the money was used.

There is in the hands of George Summers, one of the members, a like amount of \$106, coming from the sale of said old Jerusalem Church property, of which he received from a Mr. Michell into whose hands it was paid by a Mr. Reimberg, who was one of the Trustees who received the money, this amount is still unpaid & claimed by the members of the Cong. at Holfsville where it rightly belongs. After considerable talk on the subject, Mr. Summers made the following proposition viz. that he would pay the principal of that money, one hundred & six dollars, but no interest, & that he would give a voluntary subscription of ten dollars towards the repairing of the building. This proposition of Mr. Summers was unanimously accepted, and was furthermore ordered, that the Treasurer of the Cong. Daniel Harensfeld, Jr. be authorized to receive this money from Mr. Summers & in the name of the Cong. receipts for it. It was furthermore urged that as a note of one hundred dollars is held against the Cong. there be no delay in settling it. It was found that there is still a deficiency of about \$50, to square up the indebtedness remaining from the repairing, an effort was made & some little money raised with other Elders.

The Consistory on May 21. 1879, indefinitely suspended  
Mr. D. L. Smith from the Comm. of the Church, for conduct unbecom-  
ing a Christian, & highly reprehensible. No citation was  
issued, his conduct being notorious & demanded attention at  
once.

The money spoken of in the preceding minutes was re-  
ceived by the Dr. D. W. Hareufeltz, Jr. & paid over as ordered  
& is recorded so, at the proper place with the other money  
and received.

During the year 1880 & 1881, the following persons, were  
members of the Consistory, P. Shutt, Dr. Biser, Elders, Wm  
Hauver, H. F. Stottelmyer, Jos. Smith deacons. During the  
Spring of 1881, Elder P. Shutt, died, and Geo. Summers was  
elected in his place. Towards the pastoral year, ending  
May 1. 1882, the following persons constituted the Consis-  
tory, Dr. Biser, Geo. Summers, Elders - E. Stottelmyer, D. Har-  
enfeltz Jr. H. F. Stottelmyer, & Jos. Smith deacons. Nothing  
of special importance came before the Consistory. The  
deacons were faithful & at the end of the pastoral year  
ending May 1. 1882, the salary of the pastor was all paid.

On the 29th. of April 1882, an election was held for one  
Elder & two deacons which resulted in the choice of William Hauver  
for Elder, & Jacob Milliam, Jr. & C. D. Stottelmyer, deacons, these elect-  
ed officers were ordained & installed on the day following, April 30, 1882  
and on the evening of the same day the members of the Consistory met,  
present, Dr. Biser, W. Hauver Elders, H. F. C. Stottelmyer, D. F. Hareufeltz Jr  
& C. D. Stottelmyer, & Jacob Milliam, deacons, Pastor present. Organized af-  
ter preaching, D. F. Hareufeltz, Jr. was elected. Dr. H. F. C. Stottelmyer  
moderate - arrangements were made for the taking subs. for pastor's support,  
after some consultation with reference to the interests of the Con-  
gregation - Adjourned.
