Ca. 1862-1865

The Smith-Bowlus House is a two-story frame dwelling with german siding and a four-bay main elevation with double entrances. The house retains 2/2windows, and four-paneled doors. Associated with the house is a frame summer kitchen with german siding, a frame chicken house, and a small frame barn. Built between 1862 and 1865 by John Smith, it was sold to Joseph Bowlus in The architecture of the house is clearly expressive of the German 1865. vernacular style of the mid 19th century, with the double entrances and simple symmetrical form of the type. This house is particularly high in integrity, with apparently original siding, sash, and principal doors. The original property was a small farm of 13 acres, not one large enough to provide a major source of income. The Froq Hollow School was formerly nearby on Monument Road and a Josiah Bowlus was cited as a teacher in Myersville during the 1860's and 1870's. The house may possibly have been built as an inducement to retain a teacher for the school.

CONTRIBUTING RESOURCE COUNT: 4

The Smith-Bowlus House is a two-story frame dwelling built between 1862 and 1865 on the north side of Monument Road about 1/4 mile west of Myersville, Frederick County, Maryland. The four-bay south elevation has two entrances and the exterior is covered with white-painted german siding. A small frame summer kitchen, also covered with german siding, a frame chicken house, and a small frame barn are also included in the property and are probably of the same period as the house.

The rectangular plan dwelling's main elevation facing south has the two entrances in the inner bays, as was typical of German houses in the 19th century. There is no evidence of a porch on the south elevation, but a modern concrete platform is in place on the south elevation. The doors have four raised panels and plain transoms. The windows are 2/2. The gable roof is standing seam metal and an exterior brick chimney, a modern addition, is located on the west gable end. The east and west elevations have two bays each and a third entrance is located on the east elevation near the northeast corner. This doorway has a paneled door with a glazed upper section. The east gable end has a scroll-sawn bargeboard ornament near the gable peak. The north elevation has three bays, each with 2/2 sash, except in the northwest bay where the opening has been made smaller and filled with a modern window, undoubtedly an indication of a bathroom addition to the interior. The interior was inaccessible for this survey.

Summer kitchen: The small frame summer kitchen was probably built at the same time as the house. It is located immediately northeast of the house. It has german siding and an exterior brick chimney on the north elevation. A door at the southwest corner is tongue-and-groove and a second door on the south elevation near the southwest corner is paneled with a glazed upper section. The sash is 2/2 and single windows are located in each elevation. The summer kitchen is scheduled for enlargement with a shed addition on the south elevation and a connecting link to the house at the west elevation, with the interior to be used for a family room, mud room, and storage. The plans for the exterior siding and windows are not known.

Chicken house: The frame chicken house is a rectangular structure located west of the house. It has a stone and concrete foundation which is integral to a stone retaining wall against the slope to the north. The building has vertical board and tongue-and-groove siding and a corrugated metal gable roof. At the southeast and southwest corners are tongue-and-groove doors. Rectangular windows are located in the center of the south elevation. Marks on the west elevation and foundation stones indicate the chicken house once had an adjoining shed roofed structure.

Barn: The small frame barn is located west of the chicken house. It has vertical siding and a metal roof. The small stall section is oriented east and west with two doors in the east elevation giving access to a feeding aisle. Behind the stalls in the west part of the barn is an open shed with a doorway on the south elevation. The north end of the barn has a drive-through passage flanked on the north by a granary enclosure. The barn has several openings cut through the vertical siding on the east and west elevations. It is currently used for storage.

The Smith-Bowlus House is an excellent representative of the exterior architecture of a typical vernacular dwelling based in the German building tradition of the mid-19th century. Built between 1862 and 1865 by John Smith, it was sold in The original tract was only 13 acres, indicating it was a 1865 to Joseph Bowlus. subsistence farm, one operated principally for a private residence rather than the prime source of income. The architecture of the house and the summer kitchen reflect the means of the occupants, solid, traditional, not pretentious. The Froq Hollow school was formerly located about 50 yards east on the south side of Monument Road during the period the house was built and Williams and McKinsey's History of Frederick County (1910) mentions a teacher named Josiah Bowlus active in Myersville in about the 1860's and 1870's. It is possible that the house was built as an incentive to retain the services of a teacher for the Frog Hollow School.

The principal feature of the Smith-Bowlus House's significance is its integrity. The lack of modern additions gives a very strong feeling of the mid-19th century to the appearance of the structure and the apparently original siding, main doors, and windows are also highly reflective of the period. Its interior features should be documented to further define the architectural theme and level of significance.




