## LETTER FROM WOLFSVILLE

Sudden Death of Mr. Jefferson M. Wolfe, Aged 73 Years.

Wolfsville, Md., May 22, 1922.

Again the uncertainty of life has been impressed upon us by the sudden death of Mr. Jefferson M. Wolfe, a life-long resident of this place. 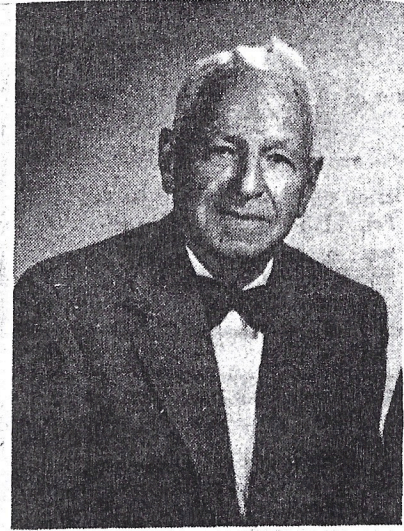
